• Tue, Feb. 28: ACT Testing in Hawaii for Grades 9-11:

All 9th & 10th grade students will be taking the ACT Aspire Test.

All 11th grade students will be taking the actual ACT. Scores can be used for college admission. ACT results are accepted by almost all U.S. colleges & universities.

The ACT is designed to assess what high school students have learned in school. The multiple-choice tests cover four skill areas: English, mathematics, reading, & science. The optional Writing Test measures skill in planning & writing a short essay. Here's a couple of simple "cheat" sheets to help juniors to review:
