• NROTC Scholarship for Juniors! https://goo.gl/JRkxvh

The NROTC scholarship is an \$180,000 scholarship awarded to individuals planning to attend a university & also interested in military service as a commissioned officer. Students are able to attend the college of their choice as long as it offers an Navy ROTC program. There is no military obligation to apply & it is free of charge. The 4 year military officer obligation only becomes mandatory after the scholarship recipient has begun their sophomore year of college, essentially making freshman year a free trial period. Due to the competitive nature of the scholarship, applicants have to meet certain requirements:

- U.S. citizen
- Medically & physically qualified by Navy/Marine Corps standards
- Score above 74 on the ASVAB, 1000 (Math & Verbal) on the SAT, or 22 on the ACT

• There are additional ways to be more competitive such as community service, participation in sports, leadership in school & the community, etc.

Applicants must fill out the online application at www.nrotc.navy.mil & will then receive assistance from the nearest recruiter in order to do physical fitness tests & schedule interviews with officers.

For the Class of 2018, the online application opens on April 1, 2017 & will close

<u>January 31, 2018.</u> It is recommended that students begin the process as early as possible to give themselves a better opportunity as there are two selection boards. Missing the first board or not being selected could allow an applicant to be better prepared for selection on the second board. I am the only Marine recruiter on Maui & can be contacted via email at lgnacio.reyes@marines.usmc.mil or by phone at 808-871-1813. My office is in Kaahumanu Mall by the walkway above the children's playground. Appointments generally are not needed but will ensure that I am in office as I may be visiting parents of Marine applicants or at schools. I will always work to answer any questions you have & am willing to speak about the scholarship to students at school in a class setting. Thank you for your time.
