He talked about how you can't be lazy and that if you want something you need to do it yourself and not wait for it to come for you. He inspired me to be more than what I am, to strive for more and excel in life. Laymon Hicks is very humorous and gets you very engage in his lecture. His speeches aren't boring and he makes you realize that your life is important, that you're important. "
