**Q&A from Fire Dept. may answer some questions (Mrs. Kovacic' Answers in blue):**

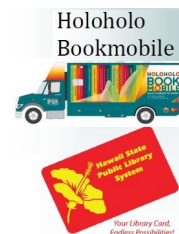
- 1) Is there a space for fire/police trucks to showcase equipment in close proximity to the

**indoor location?** Yes, outside the library, next to the quad.

- 2) **Is there space for MPD and MFD to be located next to each other?** Yes. They would like booth/table inside to attract traffic and watch recruitment video, and can send out to talk with personnel for more info. Great!
- 3) **How many people will show up?** From 9:15-10:30 students have Advisory/study hall (9:15-10:15), and recess from 10:15-10:30, so all 1060 students will be walking around at the career fair. 2nd period is from 10:30-11:52 and anyone can do a classroom presentation at that time. For instance Culinary class can host a restaurant or hotel. Auto shop can host UH Maui's auto program or Ford. MPD or MFD can present in my college career center, etc. From 11:52-12:38 students have an extended lunch and the fair can continue through lunch. What is the format? I will be inviting businesses from all over the island, and trying to match them with our career pathways. We will provide tables and chairs. MPD and MFD can showcase their equipment outside the library and play their recruitment video inside the library. Another option is playing the recruitment video in our college and career center which overlooks the quad.
- 4) **How long will students be in the space?** 9:15-10:30. They will also be there from 11:52-12:38. Please see above for specific details.

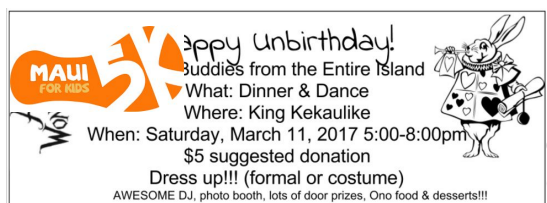
## • Foodland Shop for Higher Education!

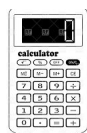
